## College and Career Readiness Performance Index (CCRPI)

On March 20, 2020, Georgia's was granted the ability by U.S. Department of Education to waive statewide assessment (Georgia Milestones), accountability (CCRPI) and reporting requirements in the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) for the 2019-2020 school year due to widespread school closures related to the novel Coronavirus disease (COVID-19).

## Parent-Teacher Tips

Parent-teacher conferences play an important role in school-home communication. The conferences are designed to increase the quality of parent-teacher communication and interaction focused on student learning and achievement. You can always contact your child's teacher, guidance counselor or principal if you have any questions or concerns.

**Things to Remember:** If you're invited to a conference, it doesn't mean your child is in trouble! Teachers try to meet with all parents. You and the teacher both want the very best for your child. You can help your child by working together as a team.

**Before the conference:** Make a list of topics that you want to discuss with the teacher.

**During the conference:** Ask for explanations of anything you do not understand.

**After the conference:** Keep in touch with the teacher during the school year.

## GEORGIA MILESTONES ASSESSMENT

The Georgia Milestones Assessment System (Georgia Milestones) is a comprehensive summative assessment program spanning grades 3 through high school. Georgia Milestones measures how well students have learned the knowledge and skills outlined in the state-adopted content standards in English language arts, mathematics, science, and social studies.

Students in grades 3 through 8 take an end-of-grade assessment in English language arts and mathematics while students in grades 5 are also assessed in science and students in grades 8 are also assessed in science and social studies. High school students take an end-of-course assessment in Algebra I, American Literature, Biology and U.S. History designated by the State Board of Education. ## School Designation Status

The Georgia Department of Education uses a method to identify schools that need additional support and improvement. As required by the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA), the designations are Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) schools and Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) schools. As part of this waiver, Georgia assures that any school that is identified for comprehensive or targeted support and improvement or additional targeted support and improvement in the 2019-2020 school year will maintain that identification status in the 2020-2021 school year and continue to receive supports and interventions consistent with the school's support and improvement plan in the 2020-2021 school year.

CSI criteria:

- Lowest 5% of Title I Schools when ranked according to their three-year College and Career Ready Performance Index (CCRPI) average
- and
- All high schools with a 4-year cohort graduation rate  $\leq$  67%

TSI criteria:

- Consistently underperforming subgroup
- Have at least one subgroup that is performing in the lowest 5% of all schools in at least 50% of CCRPI components
